<i>Attachment A: Sample Diagnosis and/or Treatment Plan</i> A basic treatment plan will have the following information: Name of client and diagnosis. Long term goal (such as client stating, "I want to heal my depression.") Short terms goals or objectives (Client will reduce depression severity from 8/10 to 5/10 within six months). A good treatment plan will have at least three goals.
